You can adjust your web browser settings to display the Cisco UC320W Configuration Utility using any supported language (see [Supported Languages in Firmware Version 2.0.x](#)).

IMPORTANT: The required tasks may vary from these instructions, depending on the browser, the version, and the operating system in use. For up-to-date information, refer to the documentation, Help files or support pages for your web browser or operating system.

Supported Languages in Firmware Version 2.0.x

The following languages are supported in Cisco UC320W firmware version 2.0.x.

- English (United States)
- French (Canada)

Google Chrome

The following instructions were prepared for Google Chrome 8.0.x. For up-to-date information, visit the Google Chrome website.

- STEP 1** Click the wrench icon on the Google Chrome toolbar.
- STEP 2** Select **Options**.
- STEP 3** Click the **Under the Hood** tab and scroll down to the **Web Content** section.
- STEP 4** Click **Change fonts and language settings**. The *Fonts and Languages* window appears.
- STEP 5** Click the **Languages** tab.
- STEP 6** To add a language for website display, click **Add**. Select a language from the list, and then click **OK**.
- Note:** If needed, you can add more than one language. To indicate your preferences, use the **Move Up** and **Move Down** buttons to adjust the order of the languages in the list. For example, if French is listed first, the Configuration Utility will display text in French. If you visit a site that does not support French, the browser will attempt to display the web page in the second language on your list.
- STEP 7** If you want to change the language for Google Chrome menus and options, choose a language from the **Google Chrome language** list.
- STEP 8** If you chose a language that requires a special font, click the **Fonts and Encoding** tab and select the appropriate settings.
- STEP 9** Click **OK** to close the *Fonts and Languages* window.
- STEP 10** Click **Close** to close the *Google Chrome Options* window.

STEP 11 Restart the browser to apply the new settings.

Internet Explorer

The following instructions were prepared for Internet Explorer 8.0.x. For up-to-date information, visit the Internet Explorer website.

STEP 1 From the **Tools** menu, choose **Internet Options**.

STEP 2 On the **General** tab, click the **Languages** button.

STEP 3 To add a language for website display, click **Add**. Select a language from the list, and then click **OK**.

Note: If needed, you can add more than one language. To indicate your preferences, use the **Move Up** and **Move Down** buttons to adjust the order of the languages in the list. For example, if French is listed first, the Configuration Utility will display text in French. If you visit a site that does not support French, the browser will attempt to display the web page in the second language on your list.

STEP 4 Click **OK** to close the *Language Preferences* window.

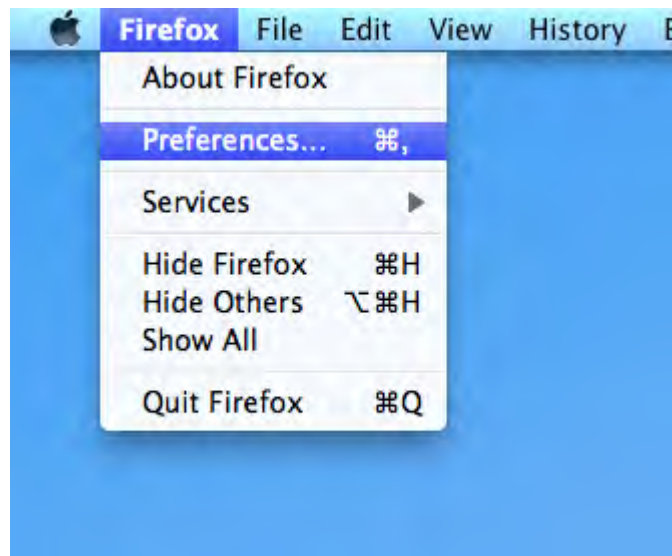
STEP 5 Click **OK** to close the *Internet Options* window.

STEP 6 Restart the browser to apply the new settings.

Firefox

The following instructions were prepared for Firefox 3.6.x. For up-to-date information, visit the Firefox website.

- STEP 1** If you are using a Mac, click Firefox on the Mac menu, and then click **Preferences**. *Skip this step if you are using a PC.*



- STEP 2** From the **Tools** menu, choose **Options**.
- STEP 3** Click the **Content** tab.
- STEP 4** In the *Languages* section, click the **Choose** button.
- STEP 5** To add a language for website display, click in the **Select languages to add** list. Choose a language, and then click **Add**.

Note: If needed, you can add more than one language. To indicate your preferences, use the **Move Up** and **Move Down** buttons to adjust the order of the languages in the list. For example, if French is listed first, the Configuration Utility will display text in French. If you visit a site that does not support French, the browser will attempt to display the web page in the second language on your list.

- STEP 6** Click **OK** to close the *Language* window.
- STEP 7** Click **OK** to close the *Options* window.

STEP 8 Restart the browser to apply the new settings.

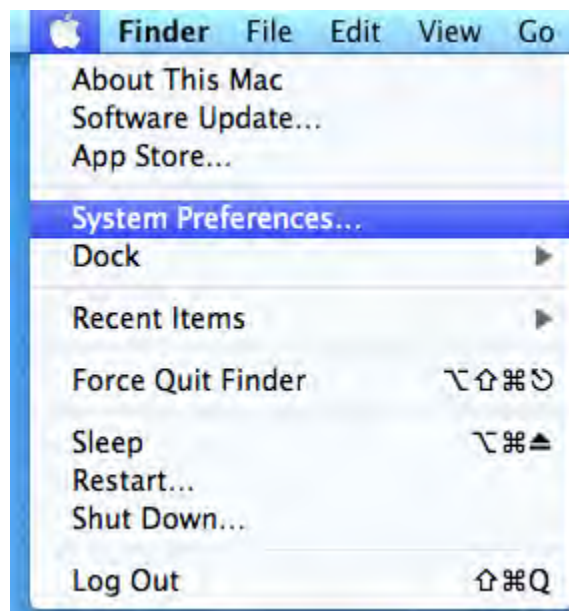
Safari

Safari on the Mac

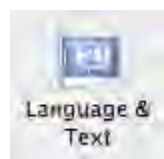
The following instructions were prepared for Safari 5.0.x. For up-to-date information, visit the Safari website.

STEP 1 Click the apple icon on the Mac menu, and then click **System Preferences**.

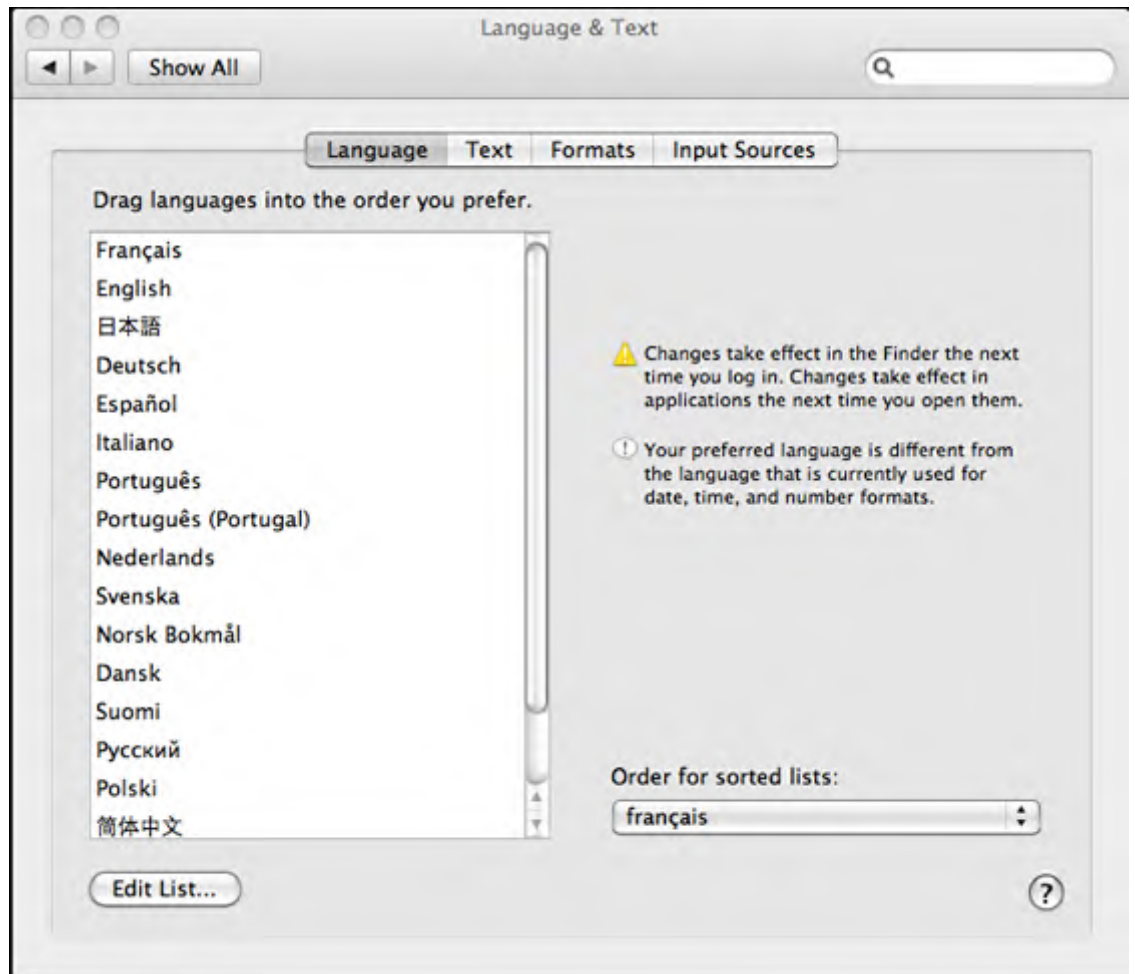


STEP 2 Click the **Languages & Text** icon.

STEP 3 Drag your preferred language to the top of the list.



STEP 4 Close the window. The changes take effect the next time that you log on to your Mac.

Safari on the PC

The following instructions were prepared for Safari 5.0.x. For up-to-date information, visit the Safari website.

Safari uses the Language & Text settings for your operating system, if you have multiple languages installed on your computer.

- STEP 1** Click the Windows Start button, point to **Control Panel**, and then click the option that is available in your version of Windows:
- **Regional and Language Options**
 - **Date, Time, Language, and Regional Options > Regional and Language Options**
- STEP 2** In the pop-up window, click the **Languages** tab.
- STEP 3** Open the **Language used in menus and dialogs** pop-up menu and choose your preferred language. This pop-up menu appears only if you have multiple languages installed on your computer.
- STEP 4** If Safari is open, quit it, and then open it again.
